Trinity Baptist Church (TBC) by Andy Banks



Our verse for 2025 is 1 Peter 3:15: "In your hearts revere Christ as Lord. Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect."

We are grateful for another good year, with a focus on growing in prayer. In August, we finally appointed our new Youth Leader, Isaac, from Lubbock, Texas. Isaac has made a wonderful start with us and in his half-time secondment to CRiBS. Alice, our brilliant new administrator joined us in December 2023. At Easter, we baptised two young adults. In October, we successfully trialled a "Try Church Sunday," where we redesigned our service specifically for those for whom church might be unfamiliar and set up a marquee in Trinity Place to serve tea and coffee before the service. Trinity Tots continues to sell out each week, our Oasis coffee shop has had a new lease of life since moving to our middle hall, and our care home services continue to be well received. We are about to start something similar in a home for adults with learning difficulties. We hosted BWS four evenings this year, alongside the Street Pastors and BCU Life Skills Centre. We've just recruited several volunteers for an expanded Pastoral Care Team for 2025. We strive to be a truly multi-cultural, multi-generational, and increasingly neuro-diverse family. Bexley Street Pastors (BSP) Registered charity 1186106



At present, BSP have Christians from ten different Churches who come together to take the love of Jesus out into the night-time economy. BSP patrol on the Broadway from 10pm until 2am, most Fridays and some Saturdays. Although the Team is small, each volunteer commits to patrolling once a month. In 2024 BSP made contact with over 1300 people, helping, caring and listening to those they met on the Broadway regardless of gender, race, age, sexuality, belief or no belief. They have engaged with venue users, door staff, rough sleepers, those waiting for transport and people who were passing through the Broadway. They have given out flip flops, bottles of water and numerous lollies. At times Street Pastors have signposted people to other organisations, administered First Aid or just directed people to where they want to go. They have helped those suffering from the effects of drink or drugs, waited with people on their own (usually females) who are waiting for transport. However, often BSP just listen to what people have to say, which may lead to prayer or a "God Chat"

The pine trees outside our south aspect have now been felled, and once the ground is ready, we hope to proceed with more sensitive planting which will enhance our grounds considerably.

2024 was a year of significant change at CRiBS. Our work continues to be well received in many schools, with our Christianity RE lessons continuing to be booked by a number of local schools. Our Unlimited work continues to provide crucial wellbeing support in primary and secondary schools across Bexley Borough and neighbouring areas. We are so thankful to God for guiding us through a year of change as He continues to be our 'Firm Foundation' at CRiBS.

We continue to thrive and grow in our new building. As well as our normal church programme, we have a growing Come and Meet Each Other (CAMEO) group for 50+s that meets on Tuesday afternoons. Our popular Community Voices Choir meets on the first Thursday of each month at 8pm. Everyone is welcome and no experience is needed. We continue to provide a Warm Meeting Space for the lonely and those struggling with the ongoing cost of living crisis throughout the year. This initiative is open on Tuesday and Friday from 10am-2pm providing free WiFi as well as an area to meet other people with free tea/coffee and biscuits/cake as well as soup and a roll at lunch time. We have also provided a drop-in centre for the homeless on a Tuesday, where we are able to provide shower facilities, emergency support as well as signposting them to help with accommodation. The local DWP and Bexley Borough Council Homeless provision send representatives each Tuesday to help with this service. As this has been so successful, we will be moving the Homeless Drop-in to Thursday from 10-2pm in the new year. Currently Bexleyheath & Welling SA fellowships are looking to partner together to make better use of our facilities in serving the local communities. The local branch of Mencap continue to meet in our building twice a week. We also work with Bexley Winter Shelter by providing our building on a Saturday night from January to the end of March for evening meals. Two other churches also use our building for their worship services. Bexleyheath Corps continues to be responsible for providing an emergency response vehicle, which is available 24/7 365 days to provide refreshments for fire, police and ambulance personnel in the event of large call-outs. We thank God for all His many blessings on our church fellowship during 2024 and look forward to all that 2025 has to offer with confidence in Him.
